# 2022 Annual Military Equipment Report

California Government Code §§ 7070, 7071, and 7072

## INTRODUCTION

On September 30, 2021, California Assembly Bill 481 (AB 481) was signed into law. California Government Code §§ 7070, 7071, and 7072 codify the requirements established by AB 481 for law enforcement's acquisition, use, and funding of "military equipment."

In enacting AB 481, the Legislature stated the public has a right to know about any funding, acquisition, or use of military equipment by state or local government officials to increase transparency, accountability, and oversight. The same applies to the public's right to participate in any government agency's decision to fund, acquire, or use such equipment.

The bill required law enforcement agencies that seek to continue the use of military equipment acquired prior to January 1, 2022, to receive approval from their governing body prior to May 1, 2022. The Monterey County Board of Supervisors approved Ordinance No. 5377 – Military Equipment. The policy and inventory list are located on the Monterey County website – [www.co.monterey.ca.us](http://www.co.monterey.ca.us).

California Government Code § 7072 requires law enforcement agencies to prepare annually, a Military Equipment Report. The annual Military Equipment Report is required to contain the following.

- 1) A summary of how the military equipment was used and the purpose of its use;
- 2) A summary of any complaints or concerns received concerning the military equipment;
- 3) The results of any internal audits, any information about violations of the military equipment use policy, and any actions taken in response;
- 4) The total annual cost for each type of military equipment, including acquisition, personnel, training, transportation, maintenance, storage, upgrade, and other ongoing costs, and from what source funds will be provided for the military equipment in the calendar year following submission of the annual military equipment report;
- 5) The quantity possessed for each type of military equipment; and
- 6) If the law enforcement agency intends to acquire additional military equipment in the next year, the quantity sought for each type of military equipment.

This annual Military Equipment Report satisfies the reporting requirements outlined in California Government Code § 7072.

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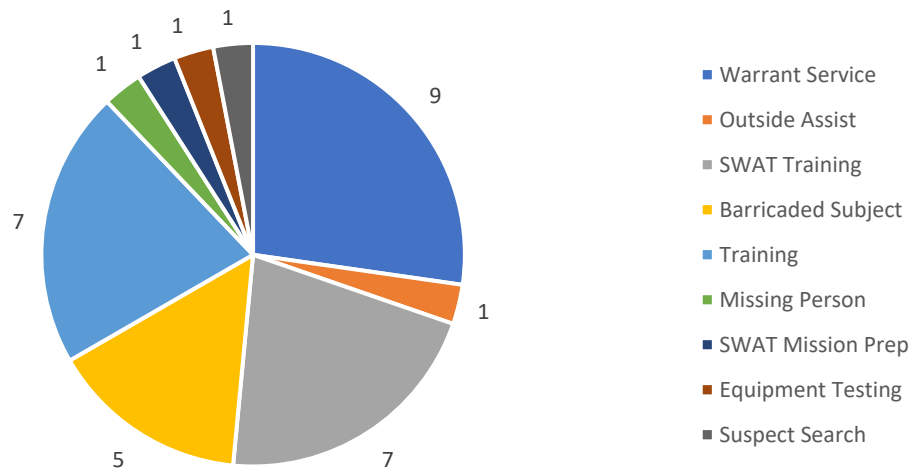

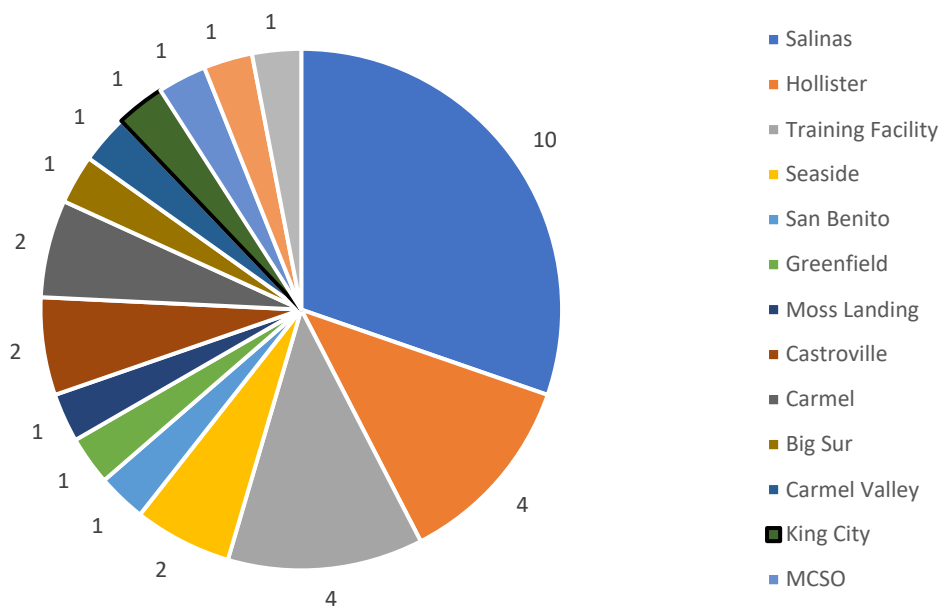

## ADDITIONAL MILITARY EQUIPMENT FOR 2023

- 1) Additional Military Equipment for 2023
  - a. The Sheriff's Office shall make the following considerations before seeking authorization for purchasing military equipment:
    - i. The equipment is necessary because there is no reasonable alternative that could provide the same objective of deputy and civilian safety.
    - ii. The equipment is reasonably cost effective compared to alternatives that can achieve the same objectives of deputy and civilian safety.
  - b. The procurement or use of any new type of military equipment, not already in possession of the Department, or approved on the current Military Equipment Policy, will require the approval of the County Board of Supervisors as outlined in Section 7071(a)(1)(A) - 7071(a)(1)(G). These procedures are also outlined in Sheriff's Policy and

Procedure Section 709.

- c. The Sheriff's Office intends to purchase additional seven (7) aerial drone(s) in the future. These purchases will be made in part, on the needs of the Sheriff's Office, availability of funding, needs to replace aging or damaged equipment and advances in technology.
  - i. One Albatross fixed-wing UAV, at an approximate cost of \$75,000, which is covered by donation.
  - ii. Six DJI identical or similar to existing equipment already in use, at an approximate cost of \$16,000 per unit. Funding for these units is incorporated into the Sheriff's Office annual budget.
  - iii. One Rook Armored Caterpillar Multi-Terrain Loader, at an approximate cost of \$475,000. This equipment will be grant-funded.
  - iv. One AMG Humvee (HMMWV), cost and funding of which is to be determined.
- d. The Sheriff's Office may need to acquire and/or replenish a certain quantity of items listed within the Military Equipment Inventory document, specifically consumable breaching, chemical and kinetic munitions, in order to maintain stock of these items for future law enforcement use. The type (make and manufacturer) would be similar to those listed in the Military Equipment Inventory document and quantity would be determined based on projected need at the time of purchase.

## CONCLUSION

In 2022, the MCSO developed and approved Department Policy 709 pertaining to military equipment as defined by AB 481. The purpose of this policy was to provide guidelines for the approval, acquisition and reporting requirements of military equipment per Government Code 7070, Government Code 7071 and Government Code 7072. This memorandum serves as the 2022 Military Equipment Annual Report and will be submitted to the Office of the Sheriff. Upon approval by the Sheriff, the report will be submitted to the Monterey County Board of Supervisors and posted on the Department website as required. Within (30) days of submitting and publicly releasing this report, the Department will announce a community engagement meeting as required.

# Military Equipment

## 709.1 PURPOSE AND SCOPE

The purpose of this policy is to provide guidelines for the approval, acquisition, and reporting requirements of military equipment (Government Code § 7070; Government Code § 7071; Government Code § 7072).

### 709.1.1 DEFINITIONS

Definitions related to this policy include (Government Code § 7070):

**Governing body** – The elected or appointed body that oversees the Office.

**Military equipment** – Includes but is not limited to the following:

- Unmanned, remotely piloted, powered aerial or ground vehicles.
- Mine-resistant ambush-protected (MRAP) vehicles or armored personnel carriers.
- High mobility multipurpose wheeled vehicles (HMMWV), two-and-one-half-ton trucks, five-ton trucks, or wheeled vehicles that have a breaching or entry apparatus attached.
- Tracked armored vehicles that provide ballistic protection to their occupants.
- Command and control vehicles that are either built or modified to facilitate the operational control and direction of public safety units.
- Weaponized aircraft, vessels, or vehicles of any kind.
- Battering rams, slugs, and breaching apparatuses that are explosive in nature. This does not include a handheld, one-person ram.
- Firearms and ammunition of .50 caliber or greater, excluding standard-issue shotguns and standard-issue shotgun ammunition.
- Specialized firearms and ammunition of less than .50 caliber, including firearms and accessories identified as assault weapons in Penal Code § 30510 and Penal Code § 30515, with the exception of standard-issue firearms.
- Any firearm or firearm accessory that is designed to launch explosive projectiles.
- Noise-flash diversionary devices and explosive breaching tools.
- Munitions containing tear gas or OC, excluding standard, service-issued handheld pepper spray.
- TASER® Shockwave, microwave weapons, water cannons, and long-range acoustic devices (LRADs).
- Kinetic energy weapons and munitions.
- Any other equipment as determined by a governing body or a state agency to require additional oversight.

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### **709.2 POLICY**

It is the policy of the Monterey County Sheriff's Office that members of this office comply with the provisions of Government Code § 7071 with respect to military equipment.

### **709.3 MILITARY EQUIPMENT COORDINATOR**

The Sheriff should designate a member of this office to act as the military equipment coordinator. The responsibilities of the military equipment coordinator include but are not limited to:

- (a) Acting as liaison to the governing body for matters related to the requirements of this policy.
- (b) Identifying office equipment that qualifies as military equipment in the current possession of the Office, or the equipment the Office intends to acquire that requires approval by the governing body.
- (c) Conducting an inventory of all military equipment at least annually.
- (d) Collaborating with any allied agency that may use military equipment within the jurisdiction of Monterey County Sheriff's Office (Government Code § 7071).
- (e) Preparing for, scheduling, and coordinating the annual community engagement meeting to include:
  - 1. Publicizing the details of the meeting.
  - 2. Preparing for public questions regarding the office's funding, acquisition, and use of equipment.
- (f) Preparing the annual military equipment report for submission to the Sheriff and ensuring that the report is made available on the office website (Government Code § 7072).
- (g) Establishing the procedure for a person to register a complaint or concern, or how that person may submit a question about the use of a type of military equipment, and how the Office will respond in a timely manner.

### **709.4 MILITARY EQUIPMENT INVENTORY**

The Sheriff's Office shall have the discretion to purchase replacement items throughout the year, as necessary, to maintain the inventory enumerated below. It is recognized that military equipment items may be used for both training and enforcement purposes, potentially requiring additional purchases to maintain sufficient inventory levels.

### **709.5 APPROVAL**

The Sheriff or the authorized designee shall obtain approval from the governing body by way of an ordinance adopting the military equipment policy. As part of the approval process, the Sheriff

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or the authorized designee shall ensure the proposed military equipment policy is submitted to the governing body and is available on the office website at least 30 days prior to any public hearing concerning the military equipment at issue (Government Code § 7071). The military equipment policy must be approved by the governing body prior to engaging in any of the following (Government Code § 7071):

- (a) Requesting military equipment made available pursuant to 10 USC § 2576a.
- (b) Seeking funds for military equipment, including but not limited to applying for a grant, soliciting or accepting private, local, state, or federal funds, in-kind donations, or other donations or transfers.
- (c) Acquiring military equipment either permanently or temporarily, including by borrowing or leasing.
- (d) Collaborating with another law enforcement agency in the deployment or other use of military equipment within the jurisdiction of this office.
- (e) Using any new or existing military equipment for a purpose, in a manner, or by a person not previously approved by the governing body.
- (f) Soliciting or responding to a proposal for, or entering into an agreement with, any other person or entity to seek funds for, apply to receive, acquire, use, or collaborate in the use of military equipment.
- (g) Acquiring military equipment through any means not provided above.

### **709.6 COORDINATION WITH OTHER JURISDICTIONS**

Military equipment should not be used by any other law enforcement agency or member in this jurisdiction unless the military equipment is approved for use in accordance with this policy.

### **709.7 ANNUAL REPORT**

Upon approval of a military equipment policy, the Sheriff or the authorized designee should submit a military equipment report to the governing body for each type of military equipment approved within one year of approval, and annually thereafter for as long as the military equipment is available for use (Government Code § 7072).

In addition, the Sheriff or the authorized designee should also make each annual military equipment report publicly available on the office website for as long as the military equipment is available for use. The report shall include all information required by Government Code § 7072 for the preceding calendar year for each type of military equipment in office inventory.

### **709.8 COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**

Within 30 days of submitting and publicly releasing the annual report, the Office shall hold at least one well-publicized and conveniently located community engagement meeting, at which the Office should discuss the report and respond to public questions regarding the funding, acquisition, or use of military equipment.

**ORDINANCE NO. 5377**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF MONTEREY, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, TO  
ADOPT A MILITARY EQUIPMENT USE POLICY PURSUANT TO ASSEMBLY BILL  
481**

**County Counsel Summary**

*This ordinance is in response to Assembly Bill ("AB") 481, which was signed into law by Governor Gavin Newsom on September 30, 2021 and is codified at Government Code section 7070 et seq. AB 481 requires California law enforcement agencies to obtain approval of their applicable governing body, by an ordinance adopting a military equipment use policy prior to taking certain actions relating to the funding, acquisition, and/or use of military equipment. This ordinance establishes a military equipment use policy by adding the attached "Military Equipment" policy to the Monterey County Sheriff's Office Policy Manual.*

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Monterey hereby ordains as follows:

**SECTION 1. FINDINGS.**

A. On September 20, 2021, Governor Gavin Newsom signed Assembly Bill ("AB") 481 into law, which is codified at Government Code section 7070 *et seq.*

B. The legislative intent behind AB 481 is to increase the public transparency by which California law enforcement agencies fund, acquire, and/or use military equipment, as defined under AB 481.

C. AB 481 requires California law enforcement agencies to obtain approval of their applicable governing body, by an ordinance adopting a military equipment use policy prior to taking certain actions relating to the funding, acquisition, and/or use of military equipment.

D. AB 481 requires California law enforcement agencies that receive approval for a military equipment use policy to submit to the applicable governing body an annual military equipment report for each type of military equipment approved by the governing body within one year of approval, and annually thereafter so long as the military equipment is available for use.

E. AB 481 requires the applicable governing body of the California law enforcement agency to annually review the military equipment use policy to either disapprove a renewal of the authorization of a type of military equipment or amend the military equipment use policy.

**SECTION 2.** The attached policy, titled "Military Equipment", shall be added to the Monterey County Sheriff's Office Policy Manual.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, or phrases be declared invalid.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall become effective on the thirty-first day following its adoption.
